The Ecology and Evolution of Infections and Disease (EEID) group at Cornell started in 2009 as a nascent University-wide program of faculty interested in the many different interactions between natural environments, organisms that comprise different ecosystems, and the pathogens and symbionts that infect different plants and animals.
