Abstract:

David Lodge and I have accepted an invitation to join the next CILER proposal (Cooperative Institute for Limnology and Ecosystems Research) as a consortium partner institution with 8 other Great Lakes US universities. The CILER organization interact with the NOAA Great Lakes Environmental Laboratory in Ann Arbor and, if funded, provides Cornell researchers opportunities for collaborations with NOAA, potential for grad student and postdoctoral fellowships, and a simplified way to receive NOAA grants. The proposal will also include funding for workshops/meetings on specific topics for Great Lakes. University of Michigan continues to be the lead institution. But this is the first time Cornell is invited to join as a consortium partner, which perhaps is an indication of increased Cornell activities in the Great Lakes. Being partners also allow us to have input into future research directions of NOAA (see the CILER research theme document).
