At this topical lunch, we will connect seemingly disparate actors across Cornell University that have an interest or want to participate in work on soils in the widest sense, garner interest in the ongoing TNC collaboration on Soils4Climate and SoilSentry, as well as probe the feasibility to propose a coordinated activity on soils at Cornell University such as NSF Science&Technology Center. Soils are literally fundamental to our existence as a species.
